160th Anniversary Of The Armenian Evangelical Church

October 2006

"How, then, can they call on the one they have not believed in? And how can they believe in the one of whom they have not heard? And how can they hear without someone preaching to them? And how can they preach unless they are sent? As it is written, "How beautiful are the feet of those who bring good news!"

Romans 10:14-15

In the month of October the Armenian churches commemorate the memory of the *Translators* who invented the Armenian alphabet in 404 A.D. But why do we still commemorate this event after so many centuries?

To answer this question let's look at the verses mentioned above. Paul argues that those who call on the name of the Lord will be saved, but that people will not call on someone they do not believe in, and to believe in someone they need to have heard about that person, but to hear about him, someone must come and tell them about that person, and the messenger to go and deliver the message they need to be sent. Paul is talking about the gospel, the Good News. In order for people to believe in God, they need to have heard about Him through those who come and preach His Word.

The Christian leaders of the day knew

that for the full conversion of the common people they needed to have the Word of God in the language that all people could understand. So, following the invention of the Armenian alphabet, St. Sahag and St. Mesrop, recruited a team of translators and the first thing they did was translate the Bible into Armenian. Then they sent the clergy, armed with this new Armenian translation, to go and preach and teach the Word of God to the common people. According to Rev. Vahan H. Tootikian, "This led the way to an unprecedented spiritual awakening for the Armenian people."

We commemorate this event because it was a defining moment in the development of the Christian faith among the Armenian people. In order for the people to be saved, they needed to believe, and in order to believe, they needed to hear the salvation message of the gospel of Jesus Christ in a language they understood.

Friends, the *Translators* gave us the alphabet and the Bible in our own language. Let's honor their memory and efforts by reading it, studying it, believing in it and by faith call on the name of the Lord so that we may be saved.

#### Armenian Evangelical Church Celebrates 160<sup>th</sup> Anniversary In Yerevan, Armenia, September 13-25, 2006 by Rev. Dr. Vahan H. Tootikian

From September 13 to 26, 2006, more than two hundred clergy and lay representatives from 15 countries joined a hundred of their fellow Armenian Evangelicals in our motherland Armenia to celebrate the 160<sup>th</sup> Anniversary of the founding of the Armenian Evangelical Church.

The celebrations included the following activities:

- 1. A press conference to the Armenian media was held at the newly purchased Armenian Evangelical Center in Yerevan, on Wednesday, September 13, 2006.
- 2. A book festival in honor of (AEWC)'s Executive Director Dr. Vahan H. Tootikian's bilingual book, The Benefits and Contributions of the Armenian Evangelical Church to the Armenian Nation, was sponsored by the Writers' Union of Armenia, on Thursday, September 14, at its headquarters in Yerevan. The president of the Writers' Union of Armenia, Dr. Levon Ananian, paid tribute to Rev. Dr. Vahan Tootikian for his literary contribution to the contemporary Armenian culture in general, and for his aforementioned book on Armenian Evangelicalism in particular. Then, he invited Rev. Joseph Matossian to give a review on the book. Selected excerpts of the book were read by the members of the Writers' Union. Then, President Ananian invited the honoree to address the audience, following which Rev. Tootikian autographed copies of his book for those writers who received complementary copies. There were more than 200 people in attendance, including some prominent Armenian writers.
- 3. A delegation of 15 lay and clergy representatives of (AEWC)'s five Unions and two organizations paid an official visit to Mr. Robert Kocharian, President of the Republic of Armenia, on Thursday, September 14. The President commended the Armenian Evangelical Church and the AMAA for their multi- dimensional services to the Armenian

- Republic and the Armenian nation in religious, educational, cultural and humanitarian realms, and congratulated the delegation on the 160<sup>th</sup> Anniversary of their church.
- 4. One of the highlights of the 160<sup>th</sup> Anniversary celebration was the All-Armenian Evangelical Conference, which was held from September 14<sup>th</sup> to 17<sup>th</sup>. Two hundred delegates and some guests attended the conference, whose main theme was "Future Directions of the Armenian Evangelical Church."
- 5. Armenian Evangelical World Council (AEWC) held its biennial meeting on September 14<sup>th</sup> and 16<sup>th</sup>, at the Armenian Evangelical Center in Yerevan.
- 6. A musical concert, in participation with select members of the national philharmonic and musical ensembles, was held on Thursday evening, September 14<sup>th</sup>.
- 7. The opening of an Armenian Evangelical Historical Exhibition, on the 160<sup>th</sup> Anniversary, took place on September 15, 2006.
- 8. The Armenian Evangelical "Avedis" Choral group presented an inspirational sacred concert, on Friday evening, September 15.
- On Saturday evening, September 16, a play from the life of Armenian national hero Soghomon Tehlirian entitled "Endless Return" was presented.
- 10. A Worship Service, attended by the two hundred delegates of the All-Armenian Evangelical Conference, as well as hundreds of members representing the forty Armenian Evangelical churches of Armenia and Nagorno Karabagh, was held on Sunday, September 17, in the Opera Hall. During the morning worship service four licensed preachers were ordained in Christian ministry. It was a moving scene to see when, thirty-one ordained ministers laid their hands over the heads of the four candidates who knelt down to receive Christian ordination.
- 11. 160th Anniverary celebration of the Armenian Evangelical Church was held in the auditorium of the American University of Armenia, on Sunday, September 17.

The 160th Anniversary celebrations of the Armenian Evangelical Church were historic, and memorable, educational, and inspirational days for those who attended.
