"But you will receive power when the Holy Spirit comes on you; and you will be my witnesses in Jerusalem, and in all Judea and Samaria, and to the ends of the earth."

(Acts 1:8)

Since the New Year, and to go along with our 90th anniversary, I have been preaching from the first chapters of the book of Acts in my Sunday morning English messages. We have been trying to catch a fresh vision of the mission of the church as we review the events that led to the formation of the first church.

The verse quoted above is Christ's last words to his disciples, just before he was taken up to heaven. These words set the church's mission, which is world evangelization. This tremendous task was not to be attempted by purely human efforts, which would make it impossible. Instead Jesus promised them power from above, the Holy Spirit, who would enable them to accomplish their mission.

Now to be clear, Christ's commission to his disciples was "...you will be my witnesses..." They were to go out after they had received the power of the Holy Spirit and testify to the whole world that the risen, living Jesus is Lord and Christ. The task of witnessing was theirs, but the task of saving is His.

As we continue to read in the book of Acts, we are told that the result of their witnessing was, "...the Lord added to their number daily those who were being saved" (2:47).

Why have we planned the Revival Meetings? Because we believe that the biblical mission of the church is to be a witness to its Lord, Jesus Christ. This is done on an individual level as believers share their faith one-on-one with others. and also on a corporate level as the church preaches and proclaims the salvation message of the gospel. Please pray that the result of these Revival meetings will be a work of the Holy Spirit among us like He did in the early church of Acts. May He convict people of their sin and draw them to Him to repent and be saved.

Friends, I invite you to join me and our church as we start our 90th anniversary celebrations by recommitting ourselves to Christ, and to the task of reaching out to people with the gospel message which is the mission of the church.

Do not miss this opportunity to invite your family and friends to hear the saving gospel of Jesus Christ preached, and to be transformed by the power of the Holy Spirit.
