"Blessed be the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ! According to his great mercy, he has caused us to be born again to a living hope through the resurrection of Jesus Christ from the dead, to an inheritance that is imperishable, undefiled, and unfading, kept in heaven for you, who by God's power are being guarded through faith for a salvation ready to be revealed in the last time..."

(see 1 Peter 1:3-9)

We are close to 2000 years since Jesus died and resurrected. 2000 years and Jesus has yet to come again. For some, this long wait would cause discouragement, doubt, or loss of interest, resulting in indifference. But what should we do? And how should we as Christians handle these things as we approach yet another Easter celebration? Peter, writing to the Christians in Asia Minor (modern Turkey) who were under heavy persecution, has a word of encouragement, he tells them not to give up hope, but to keep hope alive.

In verse 3, Peter states the **Origin and Foundation of Hope**. All real hope is derived from God and his promises. It is a gift of his mercy. This hope is a result of our salvation. We were born again into a living hope. "God is the source of this salvation. His great mercy is its cause. The new birth is the nature of it" (BBC). The foundation is the work and ministry of Jesus Christ. The truth of the resurrection of Jesus is particularly crucial in the formation of genuine hope. It makes all the difference. In verse 4 he states the **Durability of Hope**. It is incorruptible. It can never crack or decay. It can be defiled. It is in perfect condition. It is unfading. It can never change in value, glory, or beauty. In verses 6-7 he states the **Power of Hope**. Genuine hope helps us to face our trials with courage and even joy. In the famous words of William Saroyan, "...Send them into the desert without bread and water. Burn their homes and churches. Then see if they will not laugh, sing, and pray again. And when two of them meet anywhere in the world, see if they will not create a new Armenia." The Christians joy is not dependent on earthly circumstances, but on the risen, exalted Christ at God's right hand. In verses 8-9 he states the **Wonder of Hope**. Genuine hope concerns our greatest need – salvation. Jesus in John 20:29 said to Thomas, "Blessed are those who have not seen and yet have believed." So, we need to keep hope alive.

Friends, hope is a powerful concept. Without hope in the future, we have no power in the present, without hope there is no reason to live. It has been said, "Life without Christ is a hopeless end, but life with Christ is an endless hope." May God grant us the strength to persevere and the faith to remain faithful under all circumstances to the resurrected Jesus, who is our hope and salvation until He comes again in glory.

Have a blessed Easter! Come worship with us on Easter Sunday, April 8 and every Sunday.




