"...Do all things without grumbling or questioning, that you may be blameless and innocent, children of God without blemish in the midst of a crooked and twisted generation, among whom you shine as lights in the world, holding fast to the word of life, so that in the day of Christ I may be proud that I did not run in vain or labor in vain..."

(see Philippians 2:12-18)

The apostle Paul, having discussed Christ's humble self-emptying and exaltation in 2:1-10, now applies it specifically to the Philippians. First, in verses 12-13, he discusses the proper response. Paul urges the Philippians to obey as Christ obeyed, and presumably this means to work for unity by avoiding the kind of selfish ambition that leads to dissension. God has given us eternal life as a free gift. We are to live it out by lives of practical holiness. Here again we have the wonderful merging of the divine and human. In one sense, we are called on to work out our salvation. In another sense, it is only God who can enable us to do it. We must do our part, and God will do His. Second, in verse 14, the apostle discusses the proper reaction. "Do everything without complaining." "Complaining was used to describe the rebellious murmurings of the children of Israel on their journey to the Promised Land. This requires the positive outlook the apostle described elsewhere in this letter (2:1-4; 4:1-9). Complaining comes from ingratitude. "Do everything without arguing." Arguing stems from a selfish desire to prove that we are right, it is a human tendency, but not for the Christian. In Ephesians 4:29-31 we are told to put aside all bickering because it is of the old nature and not the new person of those who have been renewed by Christ. It is possible to disagree without being disagreeable. The proper reaction is to avoid arguments. Third, in verses 15-16, the apostle discusses the proper result. To be blameless and pure children of God – that is our goal. Our reputation is to be pure. Christian purity is blameless in the world's eyes, sincere in the person's own eyes, fit to stand the scrutiny of God. When this occurs, we shine like lights or stars in the universe. Our crooked and depraved world takes note of those whose lives are consistent with the faith they profess. Stars stand out (are obvious), sparkle (give beauty to the world), and shine (pointing the way, offering direction). Christians are to shine like stars in a dark world.

Friends, how can we become shining stars? By obeying the teachings of the Word of God, by continuing to be sanctified (growing in our faith), by living in peaceful unity with each other as a family of God (without complaining, and arguing with each other), by being pure and blameless, (be honest, sincere and consistent in our lives outside the church, before the watching eyes of the world).

Let me take this opportunity to invite you to come join us on Sunday, May 13 at 11:00 am as we worship our Lord, and than later at 5:00 pm as we honor our mothers at our Mother's Day Dinner.
