ACCGD to Celebrate 95th Anniversary

This year (2012) marks the 95th anniversary of the founding of the Armenian Congregational Church of Greater Detroit. A 95th Anniversary Committee has been formed to celebrate this milestone with a gala banquet to be held on Thanksgiving Sunday, November 18, 2012 at 5:00 p.m. in the Rev. Dr. Vahan H. Tootikian Hall.

The theme of our celebration is "Honoring Our Past-Claiming Our Future." This anniversary provides us with an opportunity to thank God for all those church leaders, ministers and laypeople who, labored without counting the cost to keep the torch of the faith of our fathers burning. We are the heirs of their hard work and their unwavering loyalty to Christ and His church. It behooves us to dedicate our lives and efforts to uphold their hopes and dreams that we may lead our people to uphold that torch of faith.

During the 95th anniversary banquet, God willing, we will be honoring one of the most distinguished members of our church, Dr. Richard E. Marburger who, for more than six decades has rendered most valuable service to our church and the larger community. Dr. Marburger has served our church in many capacities, especially as Moderator for many years. So, let's each of us make a phone call---or send an email---to an old friend or acquaintance.
- 3. Every ACC member should verify that they are up-to-date in making their stewardship contributions (often these lag behind in the summer months).
- 4. Ask a member of the Board of Deacons or Board of Trustees if there is a task that you can assist with. There are many small and large tasks that need to be done. We would be happy to help you find a way to contribute your talents.

We are at a critical transition phase in our church's development. We must lift each other up and support each other. I am confident that we will come through this together as a stronger church. I look forward to serving our Lord and his church with all of you over the coming months.
