Vincent Kaye Turns 104

The following article appeared in the September 27, 2012 issue of "Observer and Eccentric."

Livonia resident Vincent Kaye celebrated his 104th birthday Monday at this home in Manoogian manor Assistant Living. Kaye shared birthday cake with family and friends to commemorate the occasion.

Kaye was born in 1908 in Amasia, Armenia, which is in current-day Turkey.

Kaye's family moved to Michigan when he was a very young child. He graduated from Highland Park High School in 1927 and continued his education at both University of Detroit and Lawrence Tech University. Kaye holds the honor of being the oldest living graduate of Lawrence Tech University.

After college graduation, he spent his career in electrical engineering work at various companies in the Detroit area. Kaye's wife of 67 years, Rose, died in 2002. When asked what he attributes his long and happy life to, he said, "I attribute it all to my wonderful wife."

Kaye said his health is generally good, "Especially for someone 104," he added with a wink.

He enjoys his days at Manoogian manor talking to other residents and participating in many of the activities, especially Bingo.

Armenian Cultural Evening Was a Success

Following the recitation, Dr. Torossian, with a very informative slide show, discussed the pivotal role the fifth century Armenian Holy Translators, headed by St. Mesrop Mashtots, who invented the Armenian alphabet in the fifth century. With making a parallel between the characteristics of the fifth and the 21st century leadership, Dr. Torossian made some important Hovsep observations.

A lovely tricolor program of the day was designed and prepared by Dr. Talin. Expressing our gratitude to the two participants, Rev. Tootikian invited the audience to an informal reception.
