#### ACCGD's 95th Anniversary - A Great Success

As the plans for the ninety-fifth Anniversary of the Armenian Congregational Church of Greater Detroit unfolded, a wave of enthusiasm pervaded the Church family and friends. The enthusiasm was evidenced, first, by the eleven members of the 95th Anniversary Committee, headed by Rev. Dr. Vahan H. Tootikian, who accepted their responsibilities cheerfully and discharged them most efficiently.

The same eager interest was demonstrated by the members and friends of the Church in their prompt and generous response to the two Endowment Funds (Centennial Endowment Fund and Dr. Richard E. Marburger Endowment Fund), established by the Church Council on this milestone.

The wave of enthusiasm was at its peak on Thanksgiving Sunday, November 18, with an overflowing attendance of approximately 300 people in the Rev. Dr. Vahan H. Tootikian Hall, where honored guests added a special glitter to the occasion. Following the American and Armenian National Anthems, rendered by Rubik Mailian, with the accompaniment of our own Susan Harrison and the Invocation by Rev. Tootikian, a sumptuous thanksgiving dinner, prepared by Moses and Maggie Avakian and their crew was served to the attendees of the banquet. Preceding the meal, however, delicious hor d'oevres were offered by the talented ladies of the Church.

The Master of Ceremonies, Rev. Dr. Vahan H. Tootikian, interjected some humorous tidbits while conducting the program. He first introduced the Mayor of the City of Southfield, Mrs. Brenda Lawrence, who in her brief speech congratulated and commended the Church, and read her proclamation making November 18, 2012 the "Armenian Congregational Church Day." After Mayor Lawrence's presentation, the ceremonial cutting of the anniversary Cake (a beautiful and delicious cake specially prepared by our talented Taline Hagopian) was done jointly by the oldest member of the Church, the 104-years old Vincent Kave and the Honoree of the day, Dr. Richard E. Marburger, following the enthusiastic singing of "Happy Anniversary to the ACC" by the audience.

Then, the MC invited to the podium the Chair of the Board of Trustees, Rodney Keteyian, who made appropriate remarks, following, which, 3-minute brief but meaningful testimonies were given by Haig Arabian, Carole Basmadjian and Michael Banerian, dealing with various aspects of the Church life. Also, an Armenian poem dedicated to the Armenian Church by Vahan Tekeyian, was recited by Taline Hagopian.

After a short intermission, Rev. Tootikian spoke briefly on the theme of the 95<sup>th</sup> Anniversary - "Honoring the past, Claiming the Future." Among other remarks, he said, "We honor the past, the pioneers, the founders, the second and the third generations who, passed the torch of faith to us. We honor the past because from the past comes to us a body of experience through which we gain knowledge, a sense of belonging. We must learn from and build upon the past, but should not live in the past. We should look forward, because if we sentimentalize the past it will destroy our effectiveness in the present and will kill our aspirations for the future."

He added, "We must rededicate ourselves to be the Church of Jesus Christ with common commitment to Him and a common destination to grow in Him, and a common purpose to be His ambassadors here in this world."

Following his message, the minister recognized Dr. Richard Marburger as the honoree of the 95<sup>th</sup> anniversary. He stated that no matter where he has served, Dr. Marburger has attained in stature, and has won the admiration and affection of all. On behalf of the Church, Rev. Tootikian presented a beautiful plaque to him in recognition of his manifold services to the Church. Responding to the honor accorded to him by the Church, Dr. Marburger, in his typical humorous style, reminisced about his involvement in the Church life for more than sixty years, laying special emphasis on the Stewardship dimension of the Church. He then introduced his family members, one by one and spoke about their achievements. He ended his message with a challenging appeal to the church members to look forward and march onward.

The last part of the program was a musical one. The main performing artist was Deacon Rubik Mailian, who sang 4 songs in Armenian from the Armenian composers Komitas, Yegmalian and Babajanian, and a Christmas carol by Pietra Ayon entitle "Gesu Bambino," and ended it with the Battle Hymn of the Republic accompanied by ACC pianist Susan Harrison, and Sevahn Merian on the violin. Sevahn also performed a violin solo, entitled "Haperpan" by Komitas.

The memorable evening came to an end with the unison singing of the "Hayr Mer" and the benediction by Rev. Tootikian and Fr. Kochakian.

A very pretty commemorative booklet, consisting of 52 pages was given to the attendees. The pictorial booklet consisted of letters by church and civic dignitaries, as well as institutional information about the church.

The 95<sup>th</sup> Anniversary Committee members should be commended for their superb performance, each in his/her own capacity. They, as well as our congregation, provided ample evidence, once again, that they are capable of achieving great accomplishments.
