Announcement

We are pleased to report that the ACC Pulpit Search Committee has been successful in its mission of finding a new minister for our church. He is Pastor Shant Barsoumian of Los Angeles.

At a meeting on Sunday, December 16, 2012, the ACC Church Council unanimously approved the Pulpit Search Committee's recommendation to call Pastor Shant Barsoumian to be our Pastor.

Special Congregational Meeting Sunday, January 13, 2013

The call of the new minister is contingent upon the approval of the congregation. As such, in accordance with our church bylaws. The ACC Council has set a Special Congregational Meeting for Sunday, January 13, 2013, immediately following the morning worship service. There will be one agenda item: voting on the ACC Council's recommendation. In order for the proposal to pass, two-thirds majority of members present at the meeting are needed to approve the recommendation.

Meet Pastor Barsoumian

The weekend of January 12-13, Pastor Shant Barsoumian will visit Detroit. There will be at least two opportunities to meet with him on collective level:

- 1. The ACC Council will host an informal reception on Saturday, January 12, 2013, in the Rev. Dr. Vahan H. Tootikian Hall (time to be determined). This will be a good opportunity to meet Pastor Shant and find out more about him.
- 2. Also, Pastor Shant Barsoumian will participate in the morning service in our church on Sunday, January 13. He will deliver both the Armenian and English sermons. Following the Special Congregation Meeting, we can visit with him in the Church Hall.

A Brief Biography of Pastor Shant Barsoumian

Shant Barsoumian grew up in an Armenian home in the Los Angeles area where he attended the United Armenian Congregational Church (UACC). His early education is from the Merdinian School in Sherman Oaks, CA. Pastor Shant's spiritual education was greatly enhanced at Camp Arev which he attended for several successive summers. It was at Camp Arev that he accepted Jesus Christ as his Lord and Savior. Later, he became a Camp Counselor and, as a young man, he served there as a Program Assistant.

Pastor Shant holds a Bachelor's Degree in History (California State University Northridge) and a Master of Divinity (Talbot Theological Seminary in LaMirada, California). He gained valuable experience by serving in several churches within the Armenian Evangelical Union of North America (AEUNA). His most recent position was Christian Education Director, Armenian Presbyterian Church in Paramus, NJ. Prior to that, Pastor Shant was interim minister at the Armenian Evangelical Church in Chicago, IL. As part of his ministry training, he completed his Pastoral Internship at the First Armenian Presbyterian Church in Fresno, California. Additionally, in the summer of 2010, Pastor Shant was one of the leaders who accompanied a group of young people to Armenia as part of an Armenian Missionary Association of America (AMAA) mission trip.

In his resume, Pastor Shant states that "...through my ministry I desire to broaden the minds of those under my care and to increase their biblical knowledge in hopes of applying it and growing in their personal faith in Jesus Christ so that they may live vibrant spiritual lives."
