Are you Resolved?

A new year brings with it hope for the future. God has graciously seen us to the completion of one year and we eagerly look forward to what He has in store for us in 2014. So often we make New Year's resolutions and desire to change something in our lives, whether it is to lose an extra 10 lbs, better manage our time, or save more money we make these promises to ourselves and hope to accomplish them in the coming year through our own strength and willpower. The message is clear, "You can do it if you set your mind to it!"; "This new year will be different from the last!"; "Be your best self now!" and the like. But God's word and His wisdom give us a different message than the self-help culture around us. His advice is to rely on His strength and prioritize our lives according to His will. While the world tells us to Carpe Diem/Seize the Day and live for now, Jesus reminds us that "whoever finds his life will lose it, and whoever loses his life for my sake will find it" (Matthew 10:39).

Every time I think about Resolutions, I am reminded of the famous American preacher and theologian, the Rev. Jonathan Edwards. Before his famous sermon "Sinners in the hands of an angry God" was preached, before he helped spark and lead the First Great Awakening in America, Edwards was a young minister who sat alone one evening and at the ripe old age of 19 and wrote out 70 resolutions that would help dictate and shape his life from that point on. Each new statement began with these words "Resolved" and he set out to make these resolutions not to better his life but to become more and more obedient to God's will and grow in the spiritual realm and not of this world.

His preamble to these resolutions makes his mindset clear: "Being sensible that I am unable to do anything without God's help, I do humbly entreat him by his grace to enable me to keep these resolutions, so far as they are agreeable to his will for Christ's sake." He continues to rely on God's strength and not his own, desiring to bend his reality to God's will and not his own. Edwards not only starts his resolutions differently from the self-help gurus, he ends them differently as well. His goal in making and keeping resolutions isn't self-fulfillment but to the glory of God. He makes this goal clear in his very first resolution "Resolved, that I will do whatsoever I think to be most to God's glory and to my own good, profit, and pleasure, in the whole of my duration." George Marsden in his biography of Edwards, observes, "Jonathan directed his 'Resolutions' toward plugging every gap that would allow distraction from what he saw as his only worthy activity, to glorify God!" (Jonathan Edwards: A Life, New Haven: Yale University Press, p.50, 2003). Everything in Edwards' life, all his activities and endeavors, would have to make their way back to this chief goal.

This year instead of making frivolous resolutions about this or that worldly thing let us seek and be Resolved to follow God more carefully and diligently in every aspect of our lives.


