Armenian Tree Project

On Sunday, April 29, Jeanmarie Papelian, Esq., Executive Director of the Armenia Tree Project, made a special presentation during the coffee hour following worship.

The Armenia Tree Project is a non-profit program based in Woburn, Massachusetts and Yerevan, Armenia. They conduct important environmental projects in Armenia's cities and villages and seek support in advancing their reforestation mission. More than 5,300,000 trees have been planted to reforest Armenia, and hundreds of jobs have been created for Armenians in seasonal tree-related programs.

ATP works on three major program initiatives:

- 1. Planting Trees at Urban and Rural Sites
- 2. Environmental Education
- 3. Sustainable Development and Poverty Reduction.

ATP has a full-time staff in Armenia of over 80 people. The Yerevan office manages four state-of-the

art tree nurseries and two environmental education

centers, partners with villages to create tree-based

micro-enterprise opportunities, creates urban green

belts for public use, restores degraded forest lands, and employs hundreds of part-time workers to plant new forests.
