SYNOPSIS OF THE ARMENIAN SERMON:

Our Scripture reading for this occasion give us instructions on how we should face the future.

1. The first, from Numbers, reminds us that we should face the future with a sense of DIVINE FAVOR.

God is not an enemy; He is a friend. He is not against us; He is for us. He who walks beside us is the God with a shining face. The God who is revealed to us through Jesus Christ is a God who loves people. That kind of God has to be a smiling God.

2. The second reading is from Galatians, and it says that we face the future with FREEDOM.

Paul sums it up like this: "You are no longer a slave but a son." We do not walk into this new year with shackles on our souls. We are free humans, children of God. Christ has set us free to think, to live, to grow, to be, and to do.

3. Our third reading speaks to us of facing the future with FAITH.

We live in a world that has all kinds of problems. We face a future that is uncertain. But we don't need to be afraid. We are not in this thing alone. God is here. God is involved. He is with us today. He will be with us tomorrow. We can face the future with confidence and courage.

So I leave you with the traditional greeting of the season – HAPPY NEW YEAR. What else could it be, when the God who holds the future is the God who holds your hand?
