**SYNOPSIS OF THE ARMENIAN SERMON:** Paul was thankful for every member of the church. But in every church there is a special group of people who care a little more, do a little more, give a little more. They are the pillars of the church. No church can survive without these pillars. Pillars help share the burden, people whom the church counts on, depends on, leans on. St. Paul is writing to the pillars of the church in Thessalonica. He writes, "So then, brethren, stand firm and hold on to the traditions". This is the basic message to them, "Stand firm." What are some of the characteristics of pillars of the church?

- 1. First, Pillars stand firm, in spite of personal hardship and heartaches. They are strong at the broken place. Instead of clinging their fists in protest they fold their hands in prayer. In turn, this makes them more compassionate towards others.
- 2. Second, Pillars of the church also manage to stand firm even when the weaknesses of the organized church are all too apparent. They stand firm in spite of the obvious frailties of the church as an institution.
- 3. Third, Pillars while stand firm, they grow. They are like those trees planted beside stream of living water. They are grateful people who in spite of their personal difficulties and in spite of the flaws of their pastor, and boards and people, still stand fast and grow.
