SYNOPSIS OF THE ARMENIAN SERMON

(Luke 14:7-11)

We have all been to a banquet where our seats or tables were assigned to us. It is very frustrating when people, not liking their assigned seating, start making changes on their own and without the consent of the organizers. It seems that there are always some people who want to sit somewhere other than where they have been assigned.

In the parable recorded in Luke 14:7-11, Jesus notices that the invited guests at a banquet were picking their places of "honor. In those days, the closer your seat was to the host of the banquet the more honorable your place was. These guests however, were not picking these places because they wanted to sit with friends or family, but they were trying to look more honored and exalted before all the other guests. The irony is that they may be able to fool the other invited people, but not the host. He knows who should sit where and he has no problem asking certain guests to move and sit where they belong.

The lessons that Jesus draws from this parable are very obvious.

- 1. Selfish seeking of honor will result in bringing shame Jesus, in Luke 13:30, said, "Indeed there are those who are last who will be first, and first who will be last."
- 2. Unselfish humility will result in bringing honor.
 James 4:10 says, "Humble yourselves before the Lord, and he will lift you up."

When we put Christ first in our lives, we will not seek honor or fame – we will seek to please him. As we do this, we will remain humble before him. Humility will be rewarded in this life and in eternity.
