SYNOPSIS OF THE ARMENIAN SERMON: (Matthews 13: 13-16). The New Testament reports the Jesus healed people who were physically deaf. But today's Gospel reading deals with another kind of deafness that Jesus, apparently, could not heal. Spiritual deafness is no less a problem than it was for the elders of Israel or the first followers of Jesus. What is involved in this all-important process of hearing life's truths?

- Obviously, the first thing is to listen with our ears. We can never know what was meant until we know what was said.
- 2. The second step is to listen, not only with our ears, but also with our minds. A common figure of speech says, "It went in one ear and out the other." In other words, it was not retained or considered.
- 3. The third step, without which no hearing of truth is complete, is to listen with the heart. In The New Testament, the heart refers to that of a person that makes decisions and determines conduct. Jesus was speaking the truth about life. He wanted people to take it to heart and translate it into living. Today's reading ends with similar words "Let everyone heed what he hears."
