SYNOPSIS OF THE ARMENIAN MESSAGE

July 4, the Independence Day, celebrations remind us of the following important things:

- 1. **July 4**th **symbolizes a commitment to freedom.** Freedom without responsibility is a disaster. The name of the game is not freedom **from** but freedom **to** something. Freedom does not mean absence of restraint and authority.
- 2. **July 4**th **symbolizes a commitment to justice**. Without justice no nation can survive or grow strong. The Bible says, "Righteousness exalts a nation.
- 3. **July 4**th **symbolizes a commitment to the larger patriotism**. There are two kinds of patriotism: **narrow** and **large** patriotism. Narrow patriotism is fanaticism, chauvinism. It is the philosophy, "America love it or leave it" America needs open-minded patriots.
- 4. **July 4**th **symbolizes a commitment to Religious faith**. "In God we trust," is not and should not be lip service.

The truth of the matter is that the American declaration of independence was, is, and should be, a declaration of our dependence on God.
