Synopsis of the Armenian Message

(Luke 17: 11-19)

The story is told about an elderly woman who once said to Charles H. Spurgeon, "Ah, Mr. Spurgeon, if Jesus Christ does save me, He shall never hear the end of it."

In today's scripture passage ten lepers cry-out to Jesus for help. Jesus orders them to go and show themselves to the priests, because only the priests could declare them healed and allowed back into their communities. The ten were all cured on their way to the priests, but only one came back to thank Jesus for what he has done for him. Jesus' response to this Samaritan man is very interesting. He said to him, "Rise and go; your faith has made you well." It seems that this man through his miraculous physical healing, had grasped something more about who Jesus is, and he was healed spiritually also. He was saved by his faith.

This story teaches us that,

- God's grace, mercy and compassion are available to us, and all we need to do is approach Him humbly.
- God's mercy and graciousness are often ignored when they should be appreciated and acknowledged with gratitude.
- Another aspect of faith or faithfulness is thankfulness.
- This Samaritan was the only one to come back and give thanks to God, because he was the only one to recognize his sin and need for repentance.
