## Synopsis of the Armenian Message (Isaiah 9:6)

Today is the first Sunday of Advent. Advent season is the four Sundays preceding and leading to Christmas Sunday when we celebrate the birth of Jesus. The four candles that we will be lighting leading to Christmas are, the candle of Hope, candle of Peace, candle of Joy, and candle of Love. There will be a fifth white candle on Christmas Sunday, and that will be the Christ candle.

The Old Testament is full of prophecies speaking of the coming Messiah. Today's passage is one of them expressing the hope that Israel had for the coming leader. It is a hope that was built on whom this expected leader is. So, what does our passage teach us about this coming child?

## 1. He is a Wonderful Counselor.

This first title speaks about him being a special person who will do **w**onderful and amazing things for his people. It speaks of the wonderful wisdom he will show, and the amazing miracles that he will perform.

### 2. He is a Mighty God.
