Synopsis of the Armenian Message

(John 14:27-29)

This week I had the experience of witnessing a dying person give their last instructions and wishes to a lawyer to be written in their will. In similar situations the dying person usually wants to make sure that their earthly possessions go to their loved ones, or to whomever they designate it.

Commenting on today's passage, William Macdonald in the Believer's Commentary writes, "Here the Lord Jesus was doing that very thing. However, He did not bequeath material things but something that money could not buy – **peace**, inward **peace** of conscience that arises from a sense of pardoned sin and of reconciliation with God. Christ can give it because He purchased it with His own blood at Calvary."

Today as we light the second candle of Advent, the candle of peace, we reflect on Jesus who brings peace and reconciliation into our lives. In the 1st stanza of the Christmas carol, "Hark! The Herald Angels Sing" we sing, "Glory to the new-born King; Peace on earth, and mercy mild, God and sinners reconciled!" Jesus came to repair the broken relationship between humankind and God. He came so that once again humankind can have fellowship with God. It is this relationship between Creator and creature that brings real meaningful peace to our lives.

Now the question is, do you have that inner peace that only the "**Prince of Peace**" can give?
