SYNOPSIS OF THE ARMENIAN SERMON

(Luke 10:25-37)

Have you ever wondered how you can love God? The answer to that question could be found in this parable of the Good Samaritan. A man came to Christ, seeking the way to inherit eternal life. His question was, "What must I do." Being a Jew, and an expert in the law, he understood the attaining of eternal life through doing things for God. Performing certain religious acts, and good works. Jesus answered this man with a question that was meant to shift his thinking in a different direction. He asked this expert in the law about what the law teaches. The answer was,

- Love God your Lord with all your heart (emotions)
- Love God with all your soul (spiritual being)
- Love God with all your strength (physical being)
- Love God with all your mind (mental life)
- Love your neighbor as yourself (loving others)

The man not understanding what Jesus was trying to teach him, wanted to know *who is his neighbor*. So, Jesus gave him a practical example that teaches how if we love God whom we can't see, surely we can love our neighbor whom we can see. As Christians we must be willing to help those in need. Though salvation is not by good works, salvation will produce good works. If we want to love God, we need to love our neighbor. For in loving our neighbor whom we can see. we come to love God whom we don't see.
