SYNOPSIS OF THE ARMENIAN SERMON

In Luke 16:19-31 Jesus tells the account of two men's lives, their death and their situation in the hereafter.

The Two Men in the Story (vs. 19-21)

- A. A Rich man he lived in luxury. He wore the most expensive clothing, and his table was filled with the best food. He lived selfishly with no real love for God and no care for the needy.
- B. A poor man he begged for a living. He did not have any money for medicine to cure his body that was full of sores.

The Death of the Two Men (vs. 22-26)

- A. The Rich Man The rich man died and went to hell where he was in great torment.
- B. The poor man the poor man died and was taken to heaven by the angels.
- C. Two important points,
 - 1. It is important here to make clear that the rich man was not condemned to hell because he was rich, nor did the poor man go to heaven because of his poverty. Salvation is by faith alone in Jesus Christ, and people condemn themselves by refusing to believe. It seems that the rich man's lifestyle was a reflection of his heart's condition, and that the poor man had trusted God for his life.
 - 2. The destinies of the two men were decided based on their lives before death. Verse 26 makes it clear that once we die our destinies are fixed based on the choices we made in life. There is no possibility of reversing one's condition.

The Conclusion (vs. 27-31)

- There is a hell. But there is a heaven also.
- Our decisions in this life will determine our destinies.
- God's Word is enough to convince us and help us decide.
