SYNOPSIS OF THE ARMENIAN SERMON

(Matthew 25:31-46)

In chapter 25 of Matthew's gospel, Jesus started by teaching a parable about being ready for his return, then in a second parable he taught about being busy and productive while waiting for his return, and the third parable of this chapter describes how when he returns he will hold everyone accountable for the way they lived their lives.

In this parable we learn that when Jesus returns, the people of all the nations will be gathered before him for judgment. Jesus the Good Shepherd will take on the role of the judge who separates the sheep from the goats.

The righteous ones will be given their inheritance, the kingdom of God that was prepared for them from the beginning "since the creation of the world." The unrighteous will be cast to hell which was "prepared for the devil and his angels."

"God's desire is that men should be blessed; hell was not originally intended for the human race. But if people willfully refuse life, they necessarily choose death" (BBC).

In this

parable we also see that Jesus' judgment is based on the way these people treated his followers (brothers of mine). The Scriptures very clearly teach that our good works are a reflection of our faith. Our good works are not intended to gain God's approval or to impress Him, but they reflect a changed heart in us. We are reminded in this parable that Christ and his people are one, and by showing kindness to those who love him we show kindness to him.
