#### SYNOPSIS OF THE ARMENIAN SERMON

(Luke 18:10-14)

In this parable Jesus addresses those who "were confident of their own righteousness and looked down on everybody else." Jesus right off the bat makes sure there is no doubt about whom he is speaking, by labeling the first person as a Pharisee. The Pharisee in the parable has a form of godliness that prides in its own qualities, its own good moral character. His prayer is all about how good he is compared to the others. In contrast the Publican or literally "toll collector", knowing his sinfulness and utter unworthiness was humbled before God. To be fair, not all Pharisees were hypocrites and bad people. In most cases they were very honest in their devotion to God. On the other hand the toll collectors were crooks who defrauded their people. They operated booths for collecting taxes on behalf of the tax collectors. They were more despised than the tax collectors because they cheated people to make money themselves.

The Pharisee was not really praying, but rather boasting of his own goodness to God. He was comparing himself to the toll collector instead of to God's standards to see how sinful he was. The Publican acknowledged his sinfulness before God, and his need of God's mercy.

Jesus ends the parable by pointing out that the Publican who came before God in humility and repentance went home justified. God seeks people who approach Him with humility, people who are willing to acknowledge their sinfulness and their need of His grace and mercy.
