SYNOPSIS FOR THE ARMENIAN SERMON

In Matthew 20:1-16 we have a parable about a vineyard owner (symbolizing God), who hires workers at different hours of the day, and at the end of the day pays them all the same amount. In a postmodern world that is defined by democracy and equal rights, this parable makes one ask, "Where is fairness?" Stiller says, "This parable is not an implicit instruction by Jesus on management theory. Jesus gives no indication that he was promoting a certain economic or labor theory or practice. This is a story only about his kingdom." Things work differently in the kingdom of God than they do in this world. In verse 15, we see that God is sovereign. He can do as He pleases. One thing we can count on and be sure of is that God knows what He is doing and that He is a loving, caring, merciful and gracious God. He will reward according to His knowledge and not according to what we consider fair and equal. "God rewards us with generosity and not according to our accomplishments" (Stiller). In verse 16, Jesus concludes the parable by telling his listeners that things are not always what they look and seem on the surface. In the end there will be surprises. Those who we think deserve to be first might end up being last. Let's just remember that first the call to service comes from God. God calls all kinds of people and under all kinds of circumstances. And God will reward them according to His choice.
