SYNOPSIS FOR THE ARMENIAN SERMON

For Armenians all over the world, April 24 – the Armenian Martyrs' Day – has become a symbol expressing their deepest afflictions and affections, their profound disappointment and frustrations, their loftiest ideals and dreams, and their uttermost dedications and consecrations.

First of all, April 24 is the observance of a most calamitous tragedy, which obliterated half of the Armenian race, made our homeland a land of bloody turmoil, pillage and plunder, destruction and death. The first genocide of the 20th century perpetrated by the Turkish government from 1915-22 still gives us a haunting awareness of loss and a profound sense of sorrow.

Second, although April 24 is beyond our powers of comprehension, it can deepen our purpose of faith. As a nation, Armenians have learned that their Christian faith does not offer immunity from evil and suffering, but it offers them purpose, power and perspective to utilize their creative forces no matter where they have been. By the grace of God, the genocide did not paralyze the faith and the willpower of our people, for the surviving remnants achieved new life in the four corners of the world, in their homeland and in the Diaspora.

Third, April 24 is a reminder of man's inhumanity to man, and a time to remember unfulfilled claims. Genocides can easily be committed, (and are being committed today), when nations put their self-interests above justice and their possessions above people. Armenian new generations and the whole world should be reminded that Armenian inalienable rights still remain on the agenda of unfinished business.

Fourth, April 24 is not only a day of commemoration, but also a day of rededication. We are now being called to rededicate ourselves to the Christian principles and to Christ for which the unnumbered masses of Armenian martyrs made their supreme sacrifice.
