Synopsis of the Armenian Sermon

What Does the Lord Require of Us?

The story of today's Gospel reading is this: A father told both of his sons to go work in the family vineyard. The first said: "I am on my way, Sir," but never went. The other flatly refused, but later changed his mind and went.

The story teaches us 3 important lessons:

- 1. **Good intentions are not a substitute for good deeds.** The first son had every intention of keeping his word. He just never got around it. Most of us can sympathize with this man, because we have done the same thing. Only going to the "vineyard" and doing the work will transform good intentions into useful living.
- **2.** The goal of usefulness is achieved by genuine change. Jesus told this story to the chief priests and the elders. It would have required a radical change for them to become truly useful people. And they were unwilling to change.
- **3.** What the Lord requires of us is obedience. If you and I are going to be all that God has called us to be, we need to begin now. Jesus says: "Go to the vineyard" Don't procrastinate and don't try to find excuses. "A father had two sons...." Which son are you?
