160th Anniversary of Armenian Evangelical Movement (1846-2006)

"Today we celebrate the 160th anniversary of the founding of the Armenian Evangelical Church. It was established on July 1, 1846, in the Pera district of Istanbul, Turkey. The founding members were composed of 37 men and 3 women. However, it was on November 27, 1850 that it was recognized by the Ottoman Sultan Abdul Mejid as an independent church and community. The movement had started with the intention of spreading the gospel of salvation among our people through evangelism and Christian education. The Armenian Church and community leaders were not ready at the time to accommodate the fresh ideas and activities innovated by the Society For Piety. This consisted of a group of the former students of the Armenian Seminary who became the precursors of the Armenian Evangelical Church. Eventually, an action taken by the Patriarch of the day, resulted in the separation of the spiritual reformists from the Mother Church. It must be stated that the Evangelical Movement has proved to be the religious manifestation of the 19th century Armenian general renaissance movement in the Ottoman Empire. Our 160-year history will show that as an Armenian Evangelical Church and community we have proved to be a great asset in the life of the Armenian nation. Evangelism was, and should continue to be, the raison d'etre of the Evangelical movement and church. Let us faithfully carry on our mission of evangelism with the power of the Holy Spirit." (Rev.
