SYNOPSIS OF THE ARMENIAN SERMON

(Matthew 21:33-46)

This parable speaks of the rejection of Christ. As the workers of the vineyard rejected the servants and the son of the owner, so people reject God's Son and His prophets.

Vv.~33-41, a vineyard was planted and all preparations provided for its harvesting, including caretakers. The owner sent his servants to collect the fruit of the vineyard, but the servants were killed. The owner finally sent his son, thinking they would respect him. They killed him also. Then the householder comes and destroys these wicked men and places responsible tenants in control of the vineyard.

Vv. 42-44, is a prophecy of Psalm 118:22. Christ is the cornerstone; we are the small stones making up the building. "What I mean is that the Kingdom of God shall be taken away from you and given to a nation that will give God his share of the crop" (v.43 LB). Those who acknowledge Christ, bowing before Him, will be saved. Those who reject the Son of God will be lost.

Jesus came to His own people, and they rejected Him. But those who accepted Him became sons of God (John 1:12). Whether or not a person believes in God, they will some day be accountable to God. This day is called the Day of Judgment. We will be judged based on whether we have accepted or rejected the Son. The question I would like to ask everyone of you is,

Have you accepted the Son of God as your Savior and Lord?
