Synopsis of the Armenian Message

(Galatians chapters 1&2)

In this letter we see how the Galatian churches faced a challenge to the gospel. We also learn how they dealt with that challenge.

In 1:6-10, we see that even in the earliest days of Christianity, false teaching was apparent. Paul did not overlook it, pretending it did not exist; neither did he minimize it, saying it does not matter.

In 1:11-2:10, we see that Paul's message was revealed by Jesus. He explains that the source of his gospel was not from any man, but a direct revelation from Christ. His message was also confirmed by the apostles as they accepted him and encourage him in his ministry.

In 2:11-21, we see that the gospel needs to be defended. The gospel demands that all people bring their doctrine into harmony with it, regardless of popular opinion. The gospel also needs to be demonstrated. Godly living is the mark of a believer. The attacks of the ungodly are silenced by righteous living (1 Peter 2:15).
