Synopsis of the Armenian Message

(John 1:1-5)


Last week we started by talking about how Jesus is the promised Messiah who came as the full revelation of God and in fulfillment of Old Testament prophesies. John's gospel does not have a birth narrative like Matthew, and Luke, but today in five short verses we are told a lot about Jesus' origins and who He is. Jesus is from the beginning. John does not trace the beginning of His earthly life, but shows how Jesus does not really have a beginning because He is from eternity. He always existed. He was always there with God and He Himself is God. He is the second person of the Trinity. Jesus is not "a god," He is not "godlike", or a "divine person," Jesus Christ is God. In the beginning when God created everything He was there, one with the Creator, creating everything that was created. He Himself was not created, but He was the Creator of all things. He also is the source of life, and this life brings light into the lives of people. Sin had brought darkness into the minds and hearts of people and Jesus came as a light that shines in the darkness. Today also, Jesus comes to us as the light that brings salvation from the darkness of sin.

Responsive Reading

Minister: In the beginning was the Word, and the Word was with God, and the Word was God.



Congr.: He was in the beginning with God. All things came into being by Him, and apart from Him nothing came into being that has come into being.

Minister: In Him was life, and the life was the light of man, and the light shines in the darkness, and the darkness did not comprehend it.

Congr.: There was the true light which, coming into the world, enlightens every man. He was in the world, and the world was made through Him, and the world did not know Him.

Minister: He came to His own, and those who were His own did not receive Him.

Congr.: But as many as received Him, to them He gave the right to become children of God, even to those who believe in His name, who were born not of blood, nor of the will of the flesh, nor of the will of man, but of God.

All: And the Word became flesh, and dwelt among us, and we beheld His glory, glory as of the only begotten from the Father, full of grace and truth.

Second Sunday Of Advent

Reader One: This is a season for planning. We make list of tasks, friends and family to visit, and holiday food to cook. Great hopes lie at the root of all our planning. Our fertile minds are opening bringing forth visions of our deepest longings.

Reader Two: Yet, planning makes us vulnerable to hurt and to our own deepest fears. Sometimes, our hopes begin to form but do not take shape. Sometimes, they lie stillborn in our dreams.

Reader Three: Even so, in the mixture of hope and despair, God is always with us gathering us in, comforting our broken hearts, gently leading us to new possibilities, and rejoicing with us.

Reader Four: As we come to worship God, we light two candles. We are aware that our planning reflects our deepest hopes and our trust. These bear witness to God's promises of new life. We are not afraid to speak out now, to tell the world that a God-sent baby is coming!

Lighting of the Two Candles

Prayer: Holy God, We are waiting and planning for the birth of your holy child. Guide us tenderly through the wilderness moments. Make the rough places smooth. Lead us through the barren times, So that our plans may grow into strong and steady incarnations of your love. This we pray in the name of Jesus, the herald of good tidings. Amen.
