# Synopsis of the Armenian Message

(John 1:29-35)

Jesus' mission on earth was clearly set from the beginning. He came to "take away the sin of the world." When John the Baptist saw Jesus coming towards him, he calls him "the Lamb of God." In the Old Testament the lamb was a sacrificial animal. God's people were instructed by Him to slay a lamb as a substitute for the forgiveness of their sins and to sprinkle its blood as a sacrifice. However, the lambs sacrificed in the Old Testament period were only a temporary solution until the time that God would provide The Lamb who would take away the sin of the world. Now that the time has come, John the Baptist triumphantly announces the arrival. John was baptizing people with water by the Jordan River in preparation for the One who was greater than him and who was to baptize people by the Holy Spirit. Jesus' mission "to take away the sin of the world" was accomplished by His death as a substitute for our sins. His death was sufficient for the whole world, but only those who receive Him as Lord and Savior are forgiven and baptized by the Holy Spirit. The Holy Spirit is given as a sign to show we belong to God.

Jesus can take away your sins and baptize you with the Holy Spirit. Why don't you draw near to Him this New Year, as He drew near to us? As we start another New Year, may we all show a deeper commitment and a stronger love towards the Lamb of God.
