Synopsis of the Armenian Message

(John 1:43-51)

On this day, as Jesus starts towards the region of Galilee, He calls Philip to follow Him. The day before two disciples of John the Baptist went after Jesus, and later brought Simon Peter to Him. Jesus is about to start His public ministry and He begins by issuing a simple call of "Follow Me!" That same simple call is still the same today. Jesus is still calling people to simply follow Him. It is a straightforward call to follow the only One who can save and who can take us to God the Father.

Philip went a and found Nathanael, and told him that he had found the Messiah, Jesus of Nazareth. Nathanael did not seem to be too impressed with the fact that the expected One, the Christ, was from Nazareth. Nazareth was an insignificant place and it was inconceivable for Nathanael that the Messiah would come from there. But it didn't take long before Nathanael was to declare that Jesus is the "Son of God; the King of Israel."

Sometimes we also are too quick to dismiss the claims of the Christian faith. But when we take the time to really look into them and meet Jesus through them, we are transformed, convinced and changed.
