Synopsis of the Armenian Message

(Revelation 2:8-11)

The second letter is addressed to the church at Smyrna(modern Izmir). The speaker (Christ) is identified here (the First and the Last, who died and came to life again). This speaks of His eternality and His victory over death. Christ is the beginning and the end (1:8), from everlasting to everlasting. He triumphed over death by His resurrection. Christ commends this church for their endurance of tribulation, persecution and suffering. Their persecution came in the form of poverty, slander, prison, and death. Because of their suffering for Christ, He does not have anything against them. This is the only one of the seven churches that Christ does not pronounce a verdict against. The appeal to this church was to, "Be faithful, even to the point of death, and I will give you the crown of life." The New Testament makes it very clear that suffering is inevitable for true Christians and for the church. We are asked to trust Christ, who also suffered, and remain steadfast in our faith. The promised reward for those who overcome is that they "will not be hurt at all by the second death." John Stott says, "If we endure, ... and by our endurance prove the genuineness of our Christian profession, we shall escape the hell which is *the second death* (v.11) and enter the heaven which is *the crown of life* (v.10)."

The message for us from this letter is that true Christians will suffer for the cause of Christ. But we are exhorted to be faithful and not fear. Christ, who is from everlasting to everlasting, controls our destiny and He has triumphed over death. His victory is ours by faith.
