SYNOPSIS OF THE ARMENIAN MESSAGE

(Matthew 7:13-14; 21:1-11)

It is spring and soon it will be summer when many people take vacations. It is recommended and certainly smart to take time before getting on the road, to plan the trip, the roads that will be taken, and the intended destination. In reality we are all travelers on the journey of life, and Jesus in Matthew 7:13-14 has some words of advice and warning for all of us. He says that there are two gates and two roads. The wide gate leads to a wide road and the small gate to a narrow road. The wide gate and road signifies ease and comfort, and it is inviting because many people can go through it. On the other hand the small gate is harder to go through and the narrow road harder to negotiate. Jesus' advice is to take the narrow road. In Matthew 21:1-11, we have the story of Jesus' journey to Jerusalem. This was certainly a planned journey for Jesus knew what was awaiting him at the end of the week, the cross. Jesus was also definitely traveling on the narrow road for the wide road would have led to escaping the cross. What are the lessons that we can learn from Jesus' journey on the narrow road? (1) The narrow road is the road of humility, (traveling on a colt). (2) it is the road of submission, (Jesus was in submission to the Father's will). It was the road of obedience, (fulfilling the Father's plan). It was the road of sacrifice, (Jesus was going to be sacrificed on our behalf). It was the road of love, (Jesus gave Himself up because He loved us). The wide road Jesus said leads to destruction, but the narrow road to life. The narrow road goes through Jesus who purchased life for us

on the cross. Which road are you traveling on?
