Synopsis of the Armenian Message

(Ephesians 3:14-21)

This is the second prayer that the Apostle offers for the Ephesians in this letter. The main points of the prayer are, (1) **the power of God** (V.16). Paul prays that God will strengthen the believers who are His family by His power. This power comes to us through the indwelling of the Holy Spirit, and is available to us to help us live and work for God. (2) **The presence of Christ** (V.17a). As God's Spirit lives within us, Christ is there. Our faith is the entrance through which He enters. As we trust Him and invite Him into our lives, He comes to live in us permanently. (3) **Rooted in Love** (V.17b-18). As we trust in Christ and He comes to live within us, we are to be rooted and grounded in His love. We were saved by His love and we live in it. It is His love that we show to others, demonstrating the reality of our trust in Him.

Friends, Paul's prayer for the Ephesians can be our prayer as well. We can experience God's power, as we know His presence, and perceive His love. This in turn lets us reach out in loving acts to the hurting world around us.
