Synopsis of the Armenian Message

In this section of the letter, James addresses the practical issue of favoritism in the church specifically, and in Christian circles in general. He begins by forbidding the practice among those who confess to be believers in Jesus Christ. In verses 1-4 we see that prejudice is a form of judging. The practice of making distinctions based on appearance wealth, caste, race, or sex is inconsistent with true Christianity and it is a denial of the faith. By doing so we are judging others as better or worse than we are. Judging should be left to God, who judges the hearts, not the external appearance. In verses 5-7 we are told that the poor will inherit God's kingdom as much as anyone because of their faith and love of God. When we show prejudice against them we are insulting God's creation, and sitting in judgment on it. God has made us all in His image and likeness, whether poor, rich, male, female, white or black. In verses 8-13 we are reminded of the second-greatest commandment, "Love your neighbor as yourself." In the context of the Christian faith, this love should come without strings attached. We should not love others conditionally, based on appearance, or any other superficial things. We love them because God loves us all the same.

Friends, if we are to be honest with ourselves, we will admit that we are guilty of practicing some form of favoritism mentioned in these verses. Let us confess our sin and pray for God's strength in our practice of the Christian faith.
