Synopsis of the Armenian Message

James so far in chapter 4 has been dealing with different sins, such as covetousness, fighting and divisions because of selfish desires. Now at the conclusion of the chapter he deals with the sin of boastful planning. The issue here is that those who are guilty of this sin are persons who have totally taken God out of the picture of their future plans. They act as if God has no bearing on their future plans. Instead of consulting Him and planning in dependence on Him, they act as if they are in control of things. James reminds us how our lives are so frail and unpredictable. Nothing is for sure from one minute to the other. Only God knows and He is the only one who holds the future.

Friends, it is wise to plan for the future, but let us remember that our plans, destinies and even our own lives are in His hands. So let us plan in dependence on Him.
