### **Synopsis of the Armenian Message**

(James 5:13-20)

In the closing section of his letter, James turns to the subject of prayer. He exhorts us to pray in all circumstances. Whether we are in trouble, or sick, or everything is just fine and we are happy, he says we should pray and praise God. Our prayer should be in faith, trusting God to act according to His will. We should also pray to ask God for forgiveness. After using Elijah as an example of faithful prayer, James closes the letter with a final exhortation to look out for those believers who are backsliding. He says if we turn a sinner from his ways to the truth (faith and fellowship with God) we will save the person from death and his sins will be forgiven. The idea here is that sin leads to death, but faith and fellowship with God leads to forgiveness of sins and life. How can we turn someone back to God? We can't alone, but we can earnestly pray for them, and ask God to show them the error of their ways.

Friends, we all admit that we believe in prayer, but the question is how much and how often do we pray? Do we pray believing that God will respond to our prayer? May we learn from these verses and practice the art of lifting God's name in prayer and praise.
