Synopsis of the Armenian Message

(Luke 1:26-38)

The angel Gabriel, who had earlier appeared to Zechariah to announce that his wife Elizabeth will be pregnant and have a son, now appears to a young virgin named Mary who was engaged to a man called Joseph to announce that she will have a child also. The angel's greeting and the explanation in verse 30 simply say that Mary had found a special privilege in God's sight. Mary had been chosen for a very special task, to be the mother of the coming Messiah. Verses 31- 35 expresses some very important truths about the Messiah. He will be conceived in the womb of Mary and be born of her. This speaks of His humanity. He was going to have a normal human birth. His name will be Jesus, meaning "God Saves" or "God is Savior." This speaks of Him coming as the Savior. He will be called the "Son of the Most High" and will be born as a result of a miracle of the Holy Spirit in the life of Mary. This speaks of His divinity. The child who will be born to Mary is also God. He will be given the throne of David and His kingdom and rule will be everlasting. God was going to bring all this about because "nothing is impossible with Him" (V.37). Mary's humble submission in her answer to the angel is an excellent example to all of us. "I am the Lord's servant. May it be to me as you have said." As we anticipate the birth of the child Jesus, may we all learn from Mary and be willing to allow God to accomplish His purposes in and through our lives.
