Synopsis of the Armenian Message

(Luke 3:21-23)

Last week we met John the Baptist who was baptizing in the Jordan River area. In this section of Luke's narrative, we have Jesus coming to John the Baptist to be baptized. It is interesting to notice in verse 21, that Jesus comes with the rest of the people who were coming to be baptized. Considering the passage from last week, verses 1-20, John's baptism is described as a "baptism of repentance for the forgiveness of sins" and that he came to prepare the way for Jesus. Here we have Jesus coming just like the rest of the people to be baptized. Why would Jesus do that? Jesus was identifying Himself with the rest of humanity. He was identifying Himself with those He came to save. Iesus cares about you and me and He identifies with us. A second thing to notice is that He prayed before He was baptized. Jesus' life was characterized by prayer, He prayed before He was baptized and at the outset of His public ministry. He prayed before choosing the twelve disciples (6:12), He prayed before He was to be arrested and taken away (22:41, 44), He prayed on many other occasions. The third thing to notice is that the Holy Spirit descends on Him and the Father expresses His approval of Jesus by these words, "You are my Son, whom I love; with you I am well pleased" (22). God is well pleased with us also when we commit ourselves to Him, and to serving Him by the power of His Holy Spirit.

How well do you identify yourself with those who are lost and in need of Christ's salvation? How important is prayer in your life?
