Synopsis of the Armenian Message

(Luke 19:41-44)

This passage is part of the triumphal entry narrative, and it happened while Jesus was riding towards the city. Yet, we, like the people who were celebrating Jesus triumphal entry get caught up in the excitement of the moment and miss these very important words of Jesus. As Jesus was riding towards Jerusalem, He looks at the city and utters these words of lament. The people who were all around Him shouting and celebrating had no idea who Jesus really was. If people would only recognize that this coming King was the expected Messiah, and if they would receive Him, then they would really experience peace. But, no, they have already decided what to do with Him and it will not be too long before these same people will shout crucify Him. Jesus, knowing what they have already determined, wept over the city. Jerusalem's history had been full of conflict, and here in verses 43-44, Jesus prophesies its destruction again by the hands the Roman general, Titus in A.D. 70. But that was not the last time Jerusalem would experience destruction, over the years it has had more wars and conflict than any city in the world. The last words of Jesus are telling, "They will not leave one stone on another, because you did not recognize the time of God's coming to you" (v. 44). Jerusalem suffered and still suffers because the people refused Jesus' offer of salvation that brings peace. The people missed Jesus' visit. They saw what they wanted to see and missed the real Jesus.

Friends, it is very easy to get caught-up in the celebrations and miss the party. It is easy to celebrate Palm Sunday, Easter and other Christian observances and miss the salvation that Jesus offers. Jesus came to Jerusalem to be arrested, tortured, and crucified to purchase our salvation. Even today, recognize Jesus' coming and trust Him with your life.
