Synopsis of the Armenian Message

(1 Peter 2:4-12)

In chapter 2 verses 4-12, Peter uses the building as a figure and says that Jesus is the Living Stone and the Corner Stone that holds the whole building together. Even though many reject this stone, He is God's choice and this Stone (Jesus) is precious to Him. Those who accept Jesus and believe on Him are being built into a "spiritual house" on the foundation of the Living Stone, those who reject Jesus stumble and fall. These people stumble because they refuse to obey God's word. Those who have embraced Jesus are called a special people belonging to God. They have been called out of darkness and into His wonderful light. For that reason we are urged to live such pure lives before those who are in darkness that they are led to praise God.

Friends, as we commemorate the 93rd anniversary of the Armenian genocide, let us remember that those who committed those atrocities were people of darkness, and even though sometimes our sinful nature desires to "do unto them as they have done unto us" (v.11), we are called to live as "a holy nation, a people belonging to God, that we may declare the praise of Him who called us out of darkness into his wonderful light" (v.9).
