Synopsis of the Armenian Message

(Romans 1:8-17)

Today we are celebrating the 162^{nd} anniversary of the Armenian Evangelical Movement. Rev. Barkev Darakjian says, "The Armenian Evangelical Movement of the 19^{th} century and evangelism have advanced concurrently, and have had a parallel history. Actually, the Armenian Evangelical Church is a product of evangelism; furthermore, evangelism is the *raison d'etre* and sole justification for the existence of the Armenian Evangelical Church. As regards to her concept of the gospel, both the revealed Living and written Words of God have become her sources of inspiration and conviction."

The apostle Paul, writing to the Romans in 1:16 says, "I am not ashamed of the gospel, because it is the power of God for the salvation of everyone who believes: first for the Jew, then for the Gentile." This power of the gospel is what opened the eyes of the small group of students who, under the leadership of the principle of the Armenian theological seminary of the Armenian Patriarchate of Istanbul, got together to study the Bible in the 1830s. Rev. Barkev says, "Nobody in those days suspected that these out of class time studies would fire the minds of some students with a spirit of evangelism. Enlightened and empowered by the truth of the gospel, those students got organized under the name of Society For Piety, or Haygazounian Society, their sole purpose being evangelizing their people. Space does not allow us to go into all the reasons and the circumstances that lead this group to convert into a church, but on July 1, 1846, with forty members, the Armenian Evangelical Church was born. Again to quote Rev. Barkey, he says, "It is very important for us to know that both the Society For Piety, and later, the Armenian Evangelical Church felt that the only justification for their existence as a separate church was their obedience to the last commission of our Lord to his disciples, "Therefore go and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, and teaching them to obey everything I have commanded you" (Matthew 28:19-20).

Friends, as we celebrate our Evangelical Church's 162nd anniversary, it is good to be reminded of our history and the purpose of having an Armenian Evangelical Church. Today, as in 1846, we exist "For the Word of God and for the testimony of Jesus Christ" (Revelation 1:2). The Armenian people, and all others, need to hear the powerful, life-transforming message of the gospel of Jesus Christ, now more than ever. Let us not be ashamed of the gospel.
