## **Synopsis of the Armenian Sermon**

(Psalm 8)

This beautiful psalm begins and ends with the shout of praise, "O LORD, our Lord, how majestic is your name!" This cry of praise acknowledges the greatness and the majesty of God. The writer reflecting on God's creation can only see the work of a great and mighty God. Innocent children with pure hearts and a simple faith praise God, yet sophisticated men debate or deny the existence of God. Jesus said, "I praise you, Father, Lord of heaven and earth, because you have hidden these things from the wise and learned, and revealed them to little children" (Matthew 11:25). As the psalmist reflects on these things, it makes him wonder about human beings, "What is man that you are mindful of him?" he asks. As the psalmist gazes into the heavens and sees the grandeur of God and His creation, he discovers two things; (1) how little or insignificant human beings are in comparison to the vastness of the universe. (2) How great human beings are as a result of the position that God has bestowed upon us.

It is true that when we realistically think about ourselves, we see that we are like a speck of dust, mortal, temporal human beings. But when we think that the same great and awesome God who made everything, also created us in His own image and likeness and gave us dominion over the rest of the creation, we see how special humans are. The New Testament acknowledges that not everything is subject to man at this time because of sin, but God's degree stands. The one man of whom this is true is Jesus Christ, the perfect man who is triumphant over sin. But the Bible says that all those who by faith have embraced Jesus share His exalted position with Him (Ephesians 1:19 – 2:7).

So, as God's redeemed people we also can join the psalmist and shout with praise, "O LORD, our Lord, how majestic is your name in all the earth!"
