# **Synopsis of Armenian Sermon**

(Psalm 46)

Psalm 46 has over the years been used to comfort and uplift discouraged hearts during times of great crises. Martin Luther wrote his famous Reformation hymn "A Mighty Fortress Is Our God" based on this psalm. The Psalm's original historical background is most likely God's miraculous deliverance of Jerusalem when it was besieged by the Assyrian army. In verses 1-3, the psalmist affirms that when God is our refuge, there is nothing to fear. In contrast to the "foaming and roaring water of the sea," in verses 4-7, the psalmist mentions the calm and quiet waters of the river that refreshes the city of God (Jerusalem). Now Jerusalem does not have a river, and what the psalmist most likely means here is that God is like a river to His city (people). In verses 8-11, we are invited to go out and witness God's decisive victory. Then, His voice is heard assuring His people to relax for He is supreme among the nations and over all the earth. The people respond with, "God is with us." What is your response in times of trouble?
