## **Synopsis of the Armenian Sermon**

(2 Peter 2:17-22)

Today we are celebrating Independence Day in the USA, and it is also the  $163^{\rm rd}$  anniversary of the founding of the Armenian Evangelical Church. It was established on July 1, 1846, in the Pera district of Istanbul, Turkey. In the passage that we have before us, Peter has some things to say that I believe are very much applicable to both, Independence Day and the establishment of the Armenian Evangelical Church.

Peter writes, "They (false prophets and teachers) promise them (people who listen to them) freedom, while they themselves are slaves of depravity – for a man is a slave to whatever has mastered him" (V.19). Then he says, "If they have escaped the corruption of the world by knowing our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ ..."(V.20). Two important points: (1) We are all slaves to our sinful nature. We might like to think that we are free, but if we are honest with ourselves we have to agree with Peter that we are slaves of our depravity. (2) Only the salvation that our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ offers can free us from our sin because He paid the penalty of sin on the cross.

Friends, real freedom is freedom from sin and its mastery over our lives. We were created by God to serve Him and glorify Him. It is only when we are freed from sin that we become truly free to serve God and glorify Him. The first Armenian Evangelicals understood this truth and their lives were transformed. After coming to a complete knowledge of the Savior Jesus Christ, they were never the same. They went out and shared this good news with others, and the rest is history as they say.

May you also experience the freedom of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ.
