Synopsis of the Armenian Message

The church of Antioch where the disciples were first called Christian was started through the missionary work of some believers from the island of Cyprus. From its inception, the church was multiracial and multicultural. So it was well prepared to send out cross-cultural missionaries. Paul and Barnabas are set apart for this task as the Holy Spirit speaks to the worshiping church. The two sail to Cyprus and as usual they first proclaim the Gospel in the Jewish synagogue. There is no mention of any response in the synagogue, yet when they come to the home of the Roman proconsul it is a different story. The pagan proconsul, Sergius Paulus is open to the Gospel message while again his Jewish attendant, Elymas opposes them and tries to turn the proconsul from believing. Elymas is blinded because he refuses to see the true light, and Sergius is converted through the "teaching about the Lord."

Friends, sometimes God opens doors in the most unlikely places. That is the amazing thing about God's sovereignty. Where do you see God at work around you? Pray that God will open your eyes to the harvest fields.
