## Synopsis of the Armenian Message

Paul and Barnabas started their first missionary journey in Antioch of Syria, sailed to Cyprus, then to Asia Minor, traveled to Antioch, Iconium, Lystra, Derbe, Perga, Attalia and returned to Antioch of Syria. Despite all the hardship and the opposition they faced they continued to proclaim Christ. Paul and Barnabas seem to have a good understanding of what it takes to establish and grow a church, "We must go through many hardships to enter the kingdom of God." God rewards their efforts by bringing people to faith in Jesus, and churches are established. After all the persecution they faced, and after they were almost killed, they go back for a follow-up visit "Then they returned to Lystra, Iconium and Antioch, strengthening the disciples and encouraging them to remain true to the faith." At this time, Paul and Barnabas also appoint elders who will oversee (Elders mean overseers) the ministry of these churches after they have left. On their return to the home church that sent them out, they reported to them all that God had accomplished through their ministry. They did this so that the Church in Antioch will be encouraged and to rejoice in "how God had opened the door of faith to the Gentiles."

Friends, the same God is still actively opening doors of faith to all kinds of people. Let us remain true to the faith, and let consider the Christmas season as another open door for us to proclaim Jesus Christ, born to save people from their sins.
