### **Synopsis of the Armenian Message**

Christmas is just five days away and in the midst of all the last minute shopping and the preparations that need to be done, we can easily lose sight of what Christmas is all about. In Luke 2:8-20 we have a record of the first Christmas.

The announcement of the birth of Jesus comes to the lowly, forgotten, shepherds out in the fields. Yet, it is an announcement of good news of great joy for everyone "for all people." It is good news because God's promised Messiah, the Savior is here. The term "Savior" means "The One who comes from God and who will save his people from their sins. God through Jesus has given us a Savior who is the solution to our sin problem. Because of sin humanity's relationship with its Creator had been broken. The good news is that Jesus had come to remedy that problem. Jesus lived a sinless life and then died on the cross as our substitute and to pay the penalty of our sin, bringing reconciliation and peace between God and man.

The shepherds reacted to the joyous message in a positive way. They hurried to go and see the newborn child. They discovered that it was all that they anticipated, and their lives took on more excitement than they had ever experienced. They shared the message with others after they had received it.

Friends, each one of us can react in the same way that the shepherds did, by having a personal encounter with the Savior and then sharing that with others. The men on whom "God's favor rests" or "God is well pleased with" are those who repent of their sins and receive Jesus Christ as Lord and Savior.

Christmas will be exciting and a happy occasion for us also if we accept its message and respond to it in a positive way. Christmas is celebrating God's greatest and most precious gift ever, His Son Jesus. We will celebrate because, "Today in the town of David a Savior has been born to you; he is Christ the Lord."
