Synopsis of the Armenian Message

Opposition to the Gospel of Jesus Christ and persecution of its preachers is a common theme in the book of Acts. In this passage we see again the suffering that God's messengers have to endure because of their message that challenges the unbelieving world.

Paul and his companions are in Macedonia, and as they were going to a prayer gathering they met a slave girl who was possessed with a spirit of divination. Because of her fortune telling she was a great source of income to her owners. When she met Paul and his companions, she began following them for few days and shouting, "These men are servants of the Most High God, who are telling you the way to be saved." Even though what she said was true, Paul discerned that the source was demonic. So, in the all-powerful name of Jesus Christ he commands the demon to come out of her. The girl is freed from her bondage, but her owners are unhappy with their loss of income. Paul and Silas are dragged before the magistrates and falsely charged, the mob joins in, and the magistrates unjustly and without any investigation orders them to be stripped, beaten, and put in prison.

Friends, following and proclaiming Jesus has a cost. In this story Paul and Silas were beaten and imprisoned for preaching Jesus. Vartan and his friends were killed for refusing to recant their faith in Jesus. Pray for boldness and strength to be willing to follow Jesus, despite the cost.
