Synopsis of the Armenian Message

In this passage, Paul continues to preach the Gospel and minister in Ephesus and "the word of the Lord spread widely and grew in power" (20). As a result of this many Ephesians turned from their idol worship to the Lord. This spiritual awaking had a negative effect on the business of idol-makers. Ephesus was the chosen cite of the temple of the goddess Diana, and therefore, a lucrative business of making and selling idols of this goddess had developed over time. A silversmith by the name of Demetrius calls for a meeting of the craftsmen to discuss the issue. Even though he tries to show that he is concerned for the reputation of Diana, His real motive is reveald when he says, "Men, you know that we receive a good income from this business." Demetrius accuses Paul of teaching that man-made gods are no gods at all. The meeting soon develops into a full fledge riot, and Paul is advised not to go anywhere near the gathered crowd. Finally the city clerk is able to quite the crowd by assuring them that there is no reason to be concerned about the image of the goddess, and that if they had any real charges they can pursue them through the legal system. The clerk seems to have won the day as he dismisses the crowd quietly.

Friends, as the Gospel message is preached it results in changed lives. As lives change people's behaviors, attitudes, and priorities are changed and this often creates opposition. Today also the Christian community is put under scrutiny because of their insistence on worshipping and following only the One true God, Jesus Christ. The challenge for you and me is whether we will compromise and adjust our beliefs or we will trust God and stand for the truth?
